Syllabus Creation

Your syllabus represents one of the first impressions that your students receive in your course. As such, it should provide a welcome invitation to learning, and be a clear guide to information about the course.

The wording used will make the difference between outlining opportunities to succeed and a contract of "do nots" and "musts."

Typically upon receiving the syllabus, students will browse to find the assessment plan so let them browse for a few minutes before guiding them through other important parts.

Syllabus Template

UBC Okanagan Senate has approved a syllabus template that all new courses are required to use. The components are as follows:

- Course Code and Number, Credits, and Full Course Title
- 2. Contact information
- 3. Academic Calendar Entry
- 4. Course Format
- 5. Course Overview, Content, Objectives
- 6. Learning Outcomes
- 7. Evaluation Criteria and Grading
- 8. Required Readings and Videos
- 9. Recommended Readings
- 10. Course Schedule
- 11. Final Examinations
- 12. Academic Integrity
- 13. UBC Okanagan Disability Resource Centre
- 14. UBC Okanagan Ombuds Office
- 15. UBC Okanagan Equity and Inclusion Office
- 16. Health and Wellness
- 17. Safewalk

It is a good idea to check with your department for any specific policies that should be added to your syllabus.

Take time in the first class to go through parts of the syllabus with your students such as:

- Course overview
- Learning outcomes
- Your contact information
- Evaluation criteria and grading
- Important dates for assessments
- Campus resources for students

Some faculty give the students a quiz about the syllabus to ensure they have read all the pertinent information.

We recommend you make your syllabus available online (using the Syllabus Module in Canvas, for example), so that the students can check for deadlines and policies throughout the term.
